Make Vacation Bible School the highlight of your summer with All Aboard! Joining in God's Journey. This Vacation Bible School curriculum examines Scripture passages in which God calls individuals to jump on board and join in a lifelong journey of faith. Using the theme of trains and locomotives, children will engage in daily activities, games, crafts, and play-based learning to familiarize themselves with Bible stories and the Christian concept of God's calling on our lives.

Ages 4 (as of Sept. 30, 2024 and fully potty-trained) through rising 5th Graders.

PreK and Kindergarten classes will meet on alternating days.

Kindergarten will meet Monday, Wednesday, and Friday;

PreK will meet on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

Nursery care will be available for younger children.

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An Update from the Search Committee

We hope your summer is off to a great start! Our search committee would like to update you on our progress in finding a new rector for Christ Church. Here are the steps in our process:

1. **Creating the Parish Profile:** This comprehensive profile will reflect who we are as a church community and what we seek in a new rector. It will be completed by early September 2024. Once published, please share it within your networks; your connections may help us find the perfect candidate.
2. **Application Review:** The diocese and search committee will carefully review all applications, considering each candidate's qualifications, experience, and alignment with our parish's needs.
3. **Virtual Interviews:** Shortlisted candidates will be invited to participate in virtual interviews conducted over Zoom.
4. **Background Checks:** The diocese will conduct thorough background checks on the finalists.
5. **In-Person Meetings:** The search committee will meet the finalists and their families in person to foster deeper connections and insights into their suitability for our church.
6. **Recommendation to the Vestry:** After careful deliberation, the search committee will recommend a final candidate to the vestry for consideration and approval.

We understand this process may take up to a year or more. Our goal is to discern wisely and avoid rushing into a decision. Selecting a candidate who fully aligns with our church community's needs and values is our priority. On June 23, we had a wonderful parish meeting to reflect on the future of Christ Church and the qualities we seek in a new rector. We also launched the Church Assessment Tool, a comprehensive survey to help us understand who we are as a church and what directions might be important for our future. Your response is crucial! For those who could not attend the June 23 meeting, makeup dates are after the 10 am service on June 30 or July 14. You can participate in person during coffee hour or on Zoom. Confirmation, Reception, Baptism, and Reaffirmation of Vows in the Episcopal Church

On Sunday, October 6, the Rt. Rev Anne B. Jolly, the Bishop of Ohio, will be visiting Christ Church. She will celebrate and preach, join us for fellowship, and also perform confirmations, receptions, re-affirmations, and baptisms in the Episcopal Church. In preparation for this day, The Rev. Peter Faass will offer classes to anyone interested in being confirmed, received, baptized, or reaffirming their faith in the Episcopal Church. These four classes will take place between services on Sundays from September 9 through September 30.

Reception is for those who were already baptized and confirmed in the Roman Catholic, Lutheran Church (ELCA), and Orthodox churches, as well as in other Provinces of the Anglican Communion. Confirmation is for baptized Episcopalians, and anyone baptized in any other Christian (Trinitarian) denomination whether they were confirmed or not.

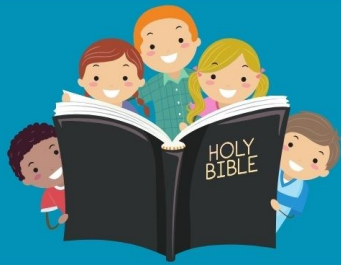

Children's Chapel

For children 3-years old through 2nd grade
SUNDAY MORNINGS DURING THE 10:00 SERVICE.

Our program year is over and we are in our summer rhythm with weekly Children's Chapel. We are continuing with the Godly Play curriculum, which uses Montessori - based learning experiences to help children explore their faith through story, to gain religious language and to enhance their spiritual experience through wonder and play. Children have an innate sense of the presence of God and this program embraces and encourages that sense. We will be encountering some of the big characters of the Old Testament as well as the parables of Jesus. Children ages 3-2nd Grade (completed) will begin each Sunday in the service with their parents. During the Hymn of Praise, they will join Sarah Bhatia or a volunteer at the front of the sanctuary and return to their families during The Peace. This program offers a great opportunity for your children to grow in their understanding of faith and experience God in new ways. Come join us!



CALLING ALL VOLUNTEERS!

- Registration/Check in (1-2 people): Make sure payment and registration info is in and correct. Pass out name tags. Greet parents and children daily
- Check out (1): greeting parents at the door at the end of each day and checking out their child(ren) with their teachers
- Service Learning (1): teach lessons and activities about the mission project for the week
- STEM (1): lead easy science and engineering experiments
- Recreation (1): lead simple games
- Shepherds (2 for each grade level 1st-6th Grade—12 total): lead group to each rotation station. Lead reflection time at the start of each day
- PreK/K Leader (3-4): lead the PreK/K classes in all activities

Support roles:

- Shopping: food for snacks, supplies for rotations, etc.
- Administrative work: making copies, cutting out materials, prepping materials for rotations
- Set up (3-4): Setting up chairs and rooms each morning (by 8:30)
- Tear down (3-4): putting chairs and supplies away at the end of each day
- Prepping crafts: getting crafts supplies ready to go for each day

Summer Outreach

Collection for the International Institute of Akron

Rest and sustenance. Two key words for survival and quality of life. Especially for people who have found a short supply of those words in their lives. We are speaking about immigrants and refugees who are landing among us at the International Institute of Akron (IIA)... an estimated 500 of them before the end of the year. Our church served them in the past by providing laptops for learning, and now we are hoping to give them something more basic... blankets and pots and pans. Finally... rest and sustenance. The need is great, but we can help!

Our drive runs from July through Sunday, August 25th. We are hoping to deliver actual piles of blankets over the summer, which can be new or gently used and clean. You can deliver them to Charlotte's old office during the week, or to the parish hall on Sundays. All sizes and colors to tuck in babies through adults. If they are pre-used, the guide should be that if you would cover yourself with the blanket, it can warm someone else.

We are also collecting money for sets of pots and pans which the IIA can purchase most economically. Write checks to Christ Church, earmarked for pots and pans. We will do the rest. Our goal is \$2500, or approximately 20 sets for 20 newly arrived families. Based on recent demographics, soon after the sweet aromas of spices from Burma, Afghanistan, Sudan, Congo, and Central and South America will be wafting upward.

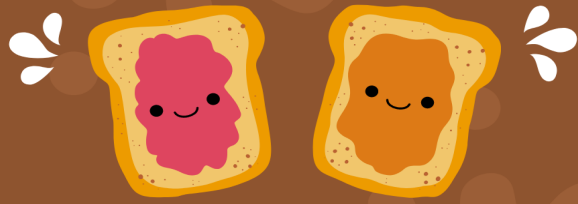

I just returned from the annual conference of the Association of Anglican Musicians (AAM), held this year in Minneapolis. AAM is a national organization for church musicians in Episcopal Churches. Every year it is like a big family reunion where we not only get to see each other but we also worship together. There is nothing quite like the sound of 175 church musicians getting together to sing at the top of their lungs! Every year I come away from this conference with new ideas, energized to plan the new year. Seeing how MN is prime Lutheran land, we got to experience a few Lutheran churches, including a very important one, Mount Olive Lutheran Church. Mount Olive has had a long tradition of strong singing since Paul Manz was Cantor. He was succeeded by two of his students who have carried on that tradition. In the Lutheran tradition a Director of Music is called The *Cantor* or *Kantor*. This was the term given to J.S. Bach when he was working. What is a *Cantor*? Well, their job is to be the steward of the assembly's song, meaning it is their job to enliven the singing of not only the choir but most importantly the congregation. This congregation SINGS. We were told that the sound of 175 church musicians singing is about on par with their regular congregation's weekly singing. Music is live and well there!

We also traveled to St. John's Abbey in Collegeville. This Abbey has been a place of great importance to the Roman Catholic Church. The Benedictine Monks still live there and take care of the Chapel, the grounds, and the college attached. The Chapel recently acquired the work of the organ builder, Martin Pasi. Worried about a succession plan for the organ company he started, Martin moved his entire factory from Washington state to Collegeville to have the Abbey take over his business. The Saint John's Abbey Organ Builders is in the process of creating their first pipe organ.

With all of this energy built up, I will sit down this summer planning out next season's music. Every summer this has become a sacred task. I sit, read the entire lectionary, and try to make sense of it through musical offerings. This, of course, requires a whole lot of work and planning on my part; however, it greatly pays off in during the start of the program year. I can't wait to sit, reflect, and dream what next season will look like at Christ Church!

Summer Concert at Christ Church Featuring World Class Artists

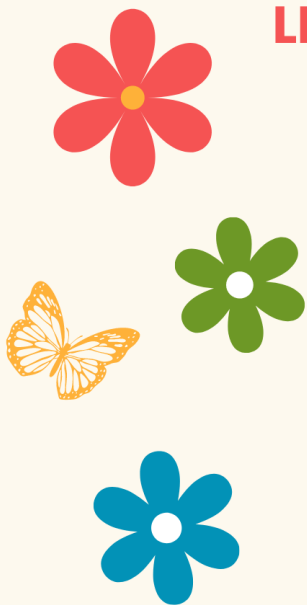

Get to Know Greg and Janet Daniels



Two senior wardens, one EFM (Education For Ministry) leader, one Bishop search committee member, one lay preacher, one Rector search committee member...the list goes on. But Greg and Janet Daniels are such a vital part of Christ Church because of WALLPAPER! When the Daniels moved to Hudson in 1987, baby Sarah (youngest of four) was a newborn. Janet asked Shirley Eells to wallpaper their new home. We know that Shirley is our #1 welcomer, but this time, while wallpapering, she asked Janet if and where the baby would be baptized. The answer: by Reed Heydt at Christ Church (now the Chapel). And the rest is history.

Greg and Janet met in 1977 when they were in training for IBM in Atlanta. Janet grew up in Cuyahoga Falls and went to Ohio Wesleyan University. Greg is from Sioux Falls, SD and attended Augustana University there. Before joining IBM, Greg was teaching math and PE in the Sioux Falls public schools. Janet worked as an intern in the US House of Representatives in Washington, DC.

After marriage, they lived in DC, where Greg continued with IBM and Janet had babies Amy and John. They moved to Atlanta for a couple of years where Peter was born. Then came the move to Hudson when IBM sent Greg to Cleveland. Along came baby Sarah shortly after they moved, then Shirley’s wallpaper, then Christ Church.

IBM took them to Grand Rapids, MI from 1992 – 2000. Charter One Bank got them back to Cleveland, and Hudson, and Christ Church, when Greg accepted a position as their CIO. Janet worked in Hudson School libraries. After a few years at Charter Bank, Greg returned to IBM as a consultant before joining the consulting group Ernst & Young accounting firm. He continues to work for EY part-time.

Greg was raised Lutheran but has become a Super Episcopalian – Senior Warden during our time of transition; he served on the Search Committee for Bishop Anne. He was also on the Diocesan Standing Committee and is on the board of Bexley-Seabury Seminary (Charlotte’s seminary). He is a frequent usher at the 10:00 services.

Janet is a fifth generation Episcopalian. She served as Senior Warden 2019–2020. She is a dedicated teacher of EFM, a skilled lay preacher, and a lector/chalice bearer. She is on the search committee for our next rector.

In addition to their many church responsibilities, they are avid cyclists and plan a cycling tour in Provence, France this summer. Janet is a master knitter and advises our church knitters when we need help. Greg also serves his alma mater, Augustana University, as a board member.

Do the names Peter and Emily Daniels sound familiar? We pray for them each Sunday. Peter is a Commander in the Navy, as a fighter pilot. His wife Emily is an attorney with JAG (Judge Advocate General – the Navy’s law firm). Their son Aaron is seven years old. The Daniels’ other children are Amy (New York City), John (Phoenix), and Sarah (Costa Rica).

As Senior Warden (Greg) and search committee member (Janet), their goal for Christ Church is a successful search for the next rector who will maintain our sense of welcome.

June Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry met on June 25 at 6:00pm.
- Treasurer, Ann Kirk, reported that the audit was successfully completed for the year.
- Theresa Edwards, vestry liaison to the Search Committee, gave an update on the committee's progress toward completing the Parish Profile. They plan to release it in September. The results of the Parish Conversation held on Sunday, June 23, will be combined with the Holy Cow survey results to provide a picture of the type of rector desired by the parish. She emphasized the importance of everyone filling out the survey to achieve the best results.
- The Church Merchandise Store will close in mid-August. Very few items were purchased over the past year.
- Greg Daniels reported on the wardens' meeting with The Rev. Peter Faass to discuss the ways he will participate in the life of Christ Church when he begins his ministry with us on August 18. In addition to serving on Sunday mornings, he will help with LEGO Church and Adult Formation.
- Pam Zuhl provided an update on plans for the program year beginning in September. The Rev. Peter Faass will teach a 4-week class beginning on September 8 to prepare parishioners seeking confirmation, reception, baptism, and reaffirmation when Bishop Anne visits on October 6. The Rev. Daniel Grosseohme will teach a 4-week Adult Formation class during this same time period. Compline will return on the third Sunday evening of each month, and Youth activities will resume with LEGO Church on the first Sunday evening and Youth Group on the first and third Sunday evenings.
- The vestry went into Executive Session at 7 pm.
- The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, July 23 at 6 pm.
